Fall Respiratory Preparedness Webinar

Join us November 13th, from 10am-11am, for the Sarnia-Lambton Fall Respiratory Preparedness Webinar

Hosted by the Sarnia-Lambton Ontario Health Team in partnership with Bluewater Health, Lambton Public Health, and Ontario Health West. Access to Non-Publicly-Funded RSVpreF3 (Arexvy) Vaccine

Ontario's Ministry of Health has initiated rollout of the publicly-funded RSVpreF3 (Arexvy) vaccine program, for individuals ages 60 years and older <u>living in</u> Long-Term Care Homes, Elder Care Lodges, and Retirement Homes that provide Dementia Care. As part of the provincial publicly-funded RSV vaccine initiative, Lambton Public Health is currently working with these institutions to ensure coordination of vaccine administration for older adults in these settings.

Patients 60 years and older who do not qualify for Ontario's publicly-funded RSVpreF3 (Arexvy) vaccine, can receive a prescription from their primary care provider and purchase the vaccine. Some private insurers may cover all or part of the cost of the vaccine. Each dose costs approximately \$250. Patients can check with their insurance company for more information on their individual coverage.

Pharmacists are not authorized to administer RSV vaccines in pharmacies at present, therefore, the vaccine should be administered in the primary care provider's office. As the respiratory season continues, updates on availability of RSVpreF3 (Arexvy) vaccine will be provided, in keeping with the provincial initiative.

RSVpreF3 (Arexvy) is only authorized for adults 60 years of age and older. In Canada, there are not currently any RSV vaccines authorized for pregnant women or infants. See the Ministry of Health's website for more information about the RSV Prophylaxis for High-Risk Infants Program.
