RSV Prevention Program for Infants and High-Risk Children

The Ministry of Health's eligible infant and high-risk children RSV prevention program includes guidance documents for health care providers at the Ministry of Health website. Eligibility and administration instructions are within the Ministry of Health documents, along with support interpreting the documents through vpdnurse@county-lambton.on.ca or 519-383-8331 ext. 3822.

Infant and high-risk children RSV prevention products include:

- Beyfortus monoclonal antibody (NACI recommended product for infants due to its effectiveness, long-lasting protection, and positive safety profile).
- Abrysvo (Discuss with pregnant patients GA 32 to 36 weeks who would rather receive the vaccine in pregnancy than have their infant receive Beyfortus).

These products are now available to order from Lambton Public Health's online order form.

Hospitals provide access points to administer Beyfortus to newborns before discharge, and primary care providers and specialists can also order and administer Beyfortus and Abrysvo for their eligible patients. Health care providers may immediately administer the product once received. The end of the RSV season will then be declared based on Ontario epidemiology.
